TV NEWS BOOSTS JACKSON, BLASTS ROBERTSON

Jesse Jackson got the best press and Pat Robertson the worst prior to Super Tuesday, a new study reports. George Bush got a big media boost when he needed it most, just before New Hampshire.

The study was conducted by the Center for Media and Public Affairs, a nonpartisan organization that carries out scientific analysis of media coverage. Researchers examined all statements aired on 532 election stories on the ABC, CBS, and NBC evening news from January 1 through March 8 (Super Tuesday). They analyzed both evaluations of the candidates and predictions of their prospects in the campaign "horse race".

## Major Findings:

- \* <u>Jackson's Rise</u> Jesse Jackson got the best press by far going into Super Tuesday with 74% favorable evaluations and 90% positive horse race predictions. His share of the Democrats' coverage nearly tripled from 9% to 26% after New Hampshire.
- \* Robertson's Fall Pat Robertson got the worst press, dropping from 70% positive evaluations before New Hampshire to only 33% afterward. His positive horse race predictions fell from 71% to 41%.
- \* <u>Bush's N.H. Boost</u> Bush's best press came when he most needed it a 66% favorable rating the week before New Hampshire. Since then Bush's good press rating sank to 44%.
- \* <u>Bad News</u> Evaluations of every major candidate became more negative after the New Hampshire primary on January 16.
- \* Horse Race Heats Up There have been four stories on the campaign horse race for every story on policy issues since the Iowa caucuses.
- \* <u>Pocketbook Issues Dominate</u> Taxes and trade relations are the issues mentioned most frequently in campaign coverage.
